STATEMENT OF FAITH

1. **The Inspiration of the Bible:** We believe the Bible is the verbally inspired Word of God. The King James Bible is the only Bible used in the college as we have confidence it is preserved by God for the English speaking world.
2. **The Person of God:** We believe God is supreme in His person, eternal in His being, absolute in His attributes, glorious in His perfection. We believe in the Trinity.
3. **The Person of Jesus Christ:** We believe in the virgin birth of Christ, His deity and sinless life, His vicarious death, His bodily resurrection and ascension, and in His personal, premillennial return.
4. **The Person of the Holy Spirit:** We believe the Holy Spirit is the executive of the Godhead. We believe that He executes the plan of God for our conversion and salvation. Christians are partakers of the Holy Spirit and empowered for service by Him.
5. **The Fall of Man:** We believe that man was created in the image of God and fell into sin and death. Hence, every person is sinful and under condemnation to eternal judgment.
6. **The Salvation of Sinners:** We believe that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace, and that Jesus Christ is the only way of salvation. Nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner but his own inherent depravity and voluntary rejection of the Gospel.
7. **The Security of the Believer:** We believe that those who receive Jesus Christ as Savior are eternally secure. Our security rests on the finished work of Jesus Christ. As a result, we have assurance.
8. **The Doctrine of the Church:** We believe that the visible church is a congregation of baptized believers, practicing New Testament principles, believing in its doctrines, observing its ordinances, and exercising its autonomy.
9. **The Doctrine of Heaven and Hell:** We believe in the eternal blessedness of the saved in Heaven and the eternal punishment of the lost in Hell and one day the Lake of Fire.
10. **Current Trends in Theology:** As a fundamental agency, we take a separatist stand regarding the current trends that lead to discrediting the Bible and undermining the fundamentals of faith. These trends include Neo-orthodoxy, Neo-evangelicalism, Neo-Pentecostalism, and the Ecumenical Movement.
11. **Personal Separation:** We believe that the Christian is holy unto God and should abstain from worldliness and all appearance of evil

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

When to Apply:

It is recommended that prospective students apply for admission six months before the anticipated entrance date although the file may be opened up to the date of registration. The earlier a student begins the application procedure, the greater the possibility of getting the exact program and courses desired.

How to Apply:

1. Application for Admission — Complete the Application for Admission form and submit to Atlantic Coast Baptist College Office of Admissions. Include the \$35 application fee.
2. School Records — Have your high school send an official copy of the high school academic record showing your date of graduation. If a GED has been completed, the official scores must be sent. The high school applicant who is completing his final semester must have the official transcripts sent after the final grades are recorded.
3. Recommendation Forms — Applicants are to have the following recommendations mailed to Atlantic Coast Baptist College: Pastor's recommendation form and two general recommendation forms.
4. Health Records — The health record provided with the application must be completed by the applicant and returned to the Office of Admissions. The form is to be submitted prior to your arrival.

4. Pre-payment Incentive
 - A. All Students paying their tuition (excluding rent and fees) by July 1 for the Fall semester or December 1 for the Spring semester will receive a 5% discount for the full tuition cost.
 - B. Students paying their bills in full by registration day will not be charged the \$50.00 finance fee.

5. Dormitory Deposit

In order for the school to properly prepare and to guarantee your dorm space, a dormitory deposit of \$100.00 must be paid by July 15 for the Fall semester or December 1 for the Spring semester. After that date, rooms will be assigned on a space available basis.

6. Financial Terms
 - A. One-fourth of a student's tuition and dorm rental must be paid prior to or during the registration process. **All fees**

are due registration day.

B. Payments for tuition and dorm rental may be made in a single payment or four equal payments. If monthly payments are made, the student is charged a \$50.00 finance charge.

7. Discounts

A. Work Aid — All full-time dorm students (12 hours or more) may apply for a \$500.00 tuition discount in return for five hours of work per week for the school. Single full-time non-dorm students may apply for a \$250.00 tuition discount in return for three hours of work per week for the school.

B. Christian Servant's Child — Children from homes where the primary "bread-winner" derives his/her main income from Christian service, may attend tuition free if they are dorm students in return for ten hours of work per week for the school or they may attend for one-half tuition if they are non-dorm students in return for five hours of work per week for the school. This applies for the student's first two semesters and he/she may apply for regular work aid thereafter.

C. Wives — Wives of full-time students may audit classes for free (paying only fees) or take classes for credit at one-half tuition plus fees.

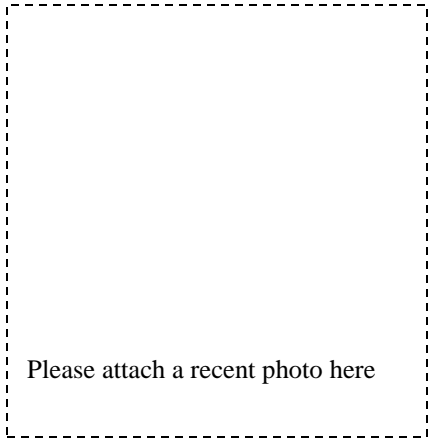
